

Responding to our Synodal journey: Beginning on Wednesday 2nd March (Ash Wednesday) the church will be open every Wednesday between 3-4pm for coffee and cakes. People can wander in and simply have a chat and some refreshments. There will also be the opportunity to say a quiet prayer or experience some easy prayer reflections around the church. Anyone willing to help, please contact Father.

First Communion Programme 2022: A reminder to parents of the children who are enrolled on to the course for First Reconciliation/First Communion. Our second session takes place next Sunday (13th February) from 11.15am – 12noon in the parish Social Centre. Please make sure the children have completed chapters 1 and 2 in their 'I belong' book. It is important that all children and at least one parent attend all these sessions so that they are well prepared to receive the Sacrament.

Racial Justice Sunday (13th February): The theme for this year's Racial Justice Sunday is; 'In the image and likeness of God'. It focuses on how everyone should see themselves, their race and culture and their history as an important aspect of the Church's life. *"Come Holy Spirit, show us your beauty reflected in all peoples of the earth, so that we may discover anew that all are important and all are necessary, different faces of the one humanity that God loves so much."* **Amen**.

Monday Exposition: Every Monday during term time the church will be open between 9.30 and 11.30am for quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. It's a great opportunity to take time out of the busyness of life for a few moments of quiet reflection. Call into church and be still and spend time in the sacred presence of the Lord. Our upper Key Stage 2 classes look forward to spending some time praying in church in this way, that is very similar to meditation.

Saint Valentine: Saint Valentine was a clergyman – either a priest or a bishop – in the Roman Empire who ministered to persecuted Christians. Like our own Saints of Beauvale, he was martyred after he too became the victim of early Roman persecution against followers of Christ. His body was buried at a Christian cemetery on the coast of the Adriatic Sea. He was executed on February 14, which has been observed as the Feast of Saint Valentine (Saint Valentine's Day) since 496. His Saints' Day has been associated with a tradition of courtly love. He is also a patron saint of epilepsy and beekeepers.

Staffing: Today is the day when we say goodbye and good luck to Miss Cottrell who is leaving school for a year to have and look after her baby – as well as Nancy-Rai. We wish them all the best and look forward to the new born baby and Miss Cottrell's return to school in a year's time. However, I am sure we will get to see Miss Cottrell in school during that time, along with Nancy and their new baby. This week we welcomed back Mrs Scrimshaw to school. She is so pleased to be back working each morning in our breakfast club – and we are so pleased to see her return – fully recovered from her long illness. Congratulations to Mrs Scrimshaw for overcoming and beating her illness with such determination. Congratulations also go to Miss Victoria Betterton who has been working in school as a Teaching Assistant and also undertaking one to one singing lessons with children. Miss Victoria was recently successful in obtaining a permanent post as a Teaching Assistant in a school in Derbyshire. She will therefore leave us at half term to take up this post.

Yesterday we said our final goodbyes to Miss Dobb who has now left school as set out in my last newsletter. The children had a wonderful last day at the park with Miss Dobb. In the drive to replace her, the job advert is on the St Ralph Sherwin Trust website and the Indeed site (as well as printed out in this correspondence). In the meantime, the school has been in contact with a teacher who specialises in longer-term supply contracts. His name is Mr Campbell and he is coming into school on Tuesday afternoon to meet the children and to work with Miss Dobb. In addition, Mr Campbell is also coming into school to on our INSET Day – again to work with Miss Dobb. My thanks again to Miss Dobb for all she has done to help the children in our school – especially our Year 4 pupils and families. After half-term, when Mr Campbell takes charge of Year 4, he will teach for all five days each week. Indeed, this is also what the new class teacher will undertake when appointed. Please pass the information on to anybody you know who is a gualified teacher so that we can seek to employ the very best possible teacher. This also means that Mrs Symonds will no longer teach Year 4 on Friday afternoons. Instead, Mrs Symonds will continue to teach on Fridays – but will do so in Reception Class along with Mrs Croke, who will now teach the class for the other four days (Monday to Thursday each week). This teaching pattern will continue until Mrs Williams returns to work from her maternity leave in May, when she will then team teach with Mrs Croke.

- Year 1 and Year 2: 3.10pm (At the near end of the Key Stage 2 Playground)
- Key Stage 2 (Year Groups 3, 4, 5 and 6: **3.15pm** (Spread out over the Key Stage 2 Playground)
