

Weekend Mass: Our Lady of Good Counsel Eastwood – Sundays 11am (streamed).

<u>Virtues to live by:</u> During this term, we have focused on the virtue of Piety and Perseverance. From the second week of November our virtue is Justice as we link the message of the Gospel into shaping our daily lives.

Monday 6th November – Perseverance - We reflect on the teachings of Jesus when he said: "Practice what you teach others to do." KS1: *"I like making good choices to teach other children."* KS2: *"I practice what I preach."*

Monday 13th November – Our virtue to live by is Justice - We reflect on the teachings of Jesus when he taught in Sunday's Gospel: "Be prepared like the five wise bridesmaids – not the five foolish ones." (Matthew 25:1-13) KS1: "I try to be ready on time at home and at school." KS2: "I know I will be rewarded for being ready, respectful and safe at all times."

Monday 20th November – **Justice** – Our virtue to live by is **Justice** - We reflect on the teachings of Jesus when he taught in Sunday's Gospel: "Use your talents wisely and you will be rewarded." (Matthew 25:14-30)

KS1: "I will get as many do-jos and stickers as I can for working hard."

KS2: "I know I will be rewarded for doing well at school and showing off my talents."

Monday 27th November – **Justice** – We reflect on the teachings of Jesus when he taught in Sunday's Gospel: "Show love, care and compassion for people who are poor, and we will be rewarded in heaven." (Matthew 25:31-46) *KS1: "I share my things with my friends, and I look after poor people."*

KS2: "I will be rewarded in heaven for sharing and caring for poor people."

Eastwood Food Bank: Please do send tinned and dried food into school as we continue to collect it in the main entrance. We wish for upper Key Stage 2 pupils to visit the Eastwood Food Bank before half-term. Thank you for your much needed generosity.

<u>Advent</u>: The first Sunday of Advent is 3rd December. Services begin in school on Monday 4th and parents, grandparents and family members are welcome to join us in our daily celebrations. Information about times will be sent out before December. **Eastwood Poppy Launch:** During the next week in the run up to Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday, pupils from Year 6 will be "selling" poppies and other items, each evening after school on the driveway. Thank you for your support.

School open days: School open days for prospective new parents and pupils who will be starting school in Reception class in September are taking place on Friday 10, 17 and 24 November, and Friday 8 December. Please tell any parents that you know who are looking for a school place for their child starting in September 2024.

Free School Meals: We were recently approached by parents who did not realise that they qualified for their children to receive free school meals. <u>Winter/Playtimes:</u> Please ensure that your son/daughter has their coat and jumper/cardigan in school for wearing at playtimes. As a school we endeavour to remain open during wintry weather. When such weather comes, your child may wish to play in any snow we may get. If it is safe to do so, he or she will only be allowed to play, if they have boots that cover the ankles, and a thick, warm coat. If it is too icy, or cold to play outdoors, the children will play inside in order to ensure their safety. During playtimes, Key Stage 2 children are allowed to change into their trainers to save their school shoes from getting ruined. If your son/daughter comes home with worn out shoes on a regular basis, you may wish to consider sending in a pair of trainers. Pupils, who wish to do this, must change back into their school shoes promptly for lessons.

Dogs: There have reports that some people are bringing dogs down the school drive at home time. Please ensure that dogs do not enter the school site at any time unless they are officially accompanying and supporting as a guide dog.

Parent Governor: The school is looking to recruit a parent governor as a vacancy has arisen. Please contact the school office by Friday 17th November if you think you would like to fulfil this role. I am on-hand to answer any questions you may have regarding this important and vital voluntary role.
