

Medicine: If your child has a minor ailment and needs medicine, please remember to complete a medical form. If not, then the medicine cannot be administered; also include advice on how much medicine is needed and when. We do all we can to support children who have minor ailments in order that they are able to stay at school and continue to learn —we know to keep you informed and contact you if we see that a child needs to go home to rest and recoup.

<u>Sun Cream:</u> In the hope for a brighter and warmer summer; it is the school's policy that we do not apply sun cream to pupils. Instead, we ask that a high-factor sun cream is applied at home before your child comes to school. If you know that your child is able to apply their own sun cream, then it must be clearly labelled with your child's name. Your child must not share their sun cream with others.

<u>Pupil Premium and Free School Meals:</u> For each pupil who receives free school meals, the government send the school a sum of money to help pay for resources and in-school provision. <u>Dogs</u>: Unless a guide dog, under no circumstances are dogs allowed onto the school premises. Thank you to all for your cooperation in this matter.

<u>PE Kit:</u> Recently some children have come to school not ready to do their PE lessons – they are lacking either part of, or all of their kit. Here is a reminder of the kit as set out in the prospectus:

Plain red shorts, plain white t-shirt or white polo shirt (with or without school logo), and black plimsolls. Throughout each year, Key Stage 2 pupils will require tracksuits, football boots or trainers for outdoor games (Class teachers will inform you as to when these will be needed as part of their half-termly class newsletters). Tracksuits should be black or navy.

Please check that your child's PE Kit is in school as Office staff have been inundated with children recently, asking for spare kit. The kit that is kept in the office is there as an emergency, on the very odd occasion when a child cannot find theirs. Kits only need to be taken home for washing during half-terms and holidays; please ensure that it goes home next week and washed ready for the final term before we break up for the summer holidays.
