

<u>Virtues to live by</u>: The virtue to live by that we have had at the forefront of our minds from mid-way through June was **Faith (Faithfulness)**: Having a clear, strong focus, and concentration on our end goals and desires. Faith is ideal for parents who would like to take their children on a journey through the virtues that build greater purpose in family life. Faithfulness means having a clear focus and a vision, which all of us can benefit from when what we pray for, and desire becomes reality.

The virtue of Faith continues throughout the month of July:

<u>Reports:</u> On Monday 15th July your child will have been issued with their end of year report. However, if you feel that there is something that you would like to discuss, then please make an appointment at the school office for a meeting before we break up from school for the summer.

<u>Helpers/Volunteers:</u> Thank you to everybody who has helped this year, working for the good of the school. Whether helping in classes, listening to readers, helping to raise funds, staying to help after school with sport and clubs, or providing the children with sacramental preparation; the school would simply not run nearly as smoothly without your input! If you think you can give time each week to helping in this area, then please see Mrs Smith as we welcome all the help and support, we can get.

<u>After School Clubs:</u> We have had a wonderful response to the after-school clubs again this term and I hope all the children have enjoyed the clubs that have been on offer. The next timetable of clubs will come out on Thursday 5th September, with the clubs restarting on Monday 9th September. Wrap around care will begin before and after school from our first day back on Wednesday 4th September.

<u>Reading Books</u>: All books should have been returned to school at the end of last week. We still have some books outstanding. Please can any remaining reading books be returned as soon as possible so that staff can sort them out before we start again in September.

New Academy Trust Attendance Policy: The academy trust has approved a new policy that the school will follow from September. The policy, which has been sent out with this newsletter, has a strong emphasis on increasing attendance, as well as deterring families from taking breaks from school during term time. The St Ralph Sherwin Multi Academy Trust will not agree to a leave of absence where pupils are taken out of school for holidays – this will be treated as unauthorised absence where a Penalty Notice will be issued.

The policy also refers to the DfE's guidance on the school census, which explains the persistent absence threshold.

- Persistent absence refers to pupils who miss 10% or more of school
- Severe absence refers to pupils who miss 50% or more of school.

Fixed Penalty Notices are expected to be issued for both persistent and severe absence rates – as set out in this table.

Equates to <u>2</u> days off a year.	99%	Excellent attendance
Equates to <u>5</u> days off a year.	97%	Good attendance
Equates to <u>10</u> days off a year.	95%	Slight concern
Equates to <u>20</u> days off a year.	90%	Concerned
Equates to <u>30</u> days off a year.	85%	Very concerned
