Easter Services: For information about Mass times and the Easter Triduum, please log onto the church website https://www.ourladyandthebeauvalemartyrs.com/ 'Triduum' is a Latin term (meaning three days) used by the church to denote the three days from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (on Maundy Thursday) and ends after evening prayers at sunset on Easter Day (on Sunday 20th April).

<u>Celebration Assemblies:</u> Take place from 1pm each Friday – unless otherwise stated.

<u>Virtue to live by</u>: **Reflection** – From our first day back at school after the easter holiday, we will be focussing on how to become better reflective learners. A child who is taught how to be more reflective in their learning is good at:

- assessing themselves whilst identify opportunities and achievements
- evaluating their own strengths and weaknesses to improve their performance
- setting goals with success criteria for their development
- communicating what they have learned
- reviewing their progress and acting on the outcomes to make improvements

<u>Tuesday 22nd April:</u> I appreciate the new life found in nature at this time of year – linked to the gospel on Easter Sunday (John 20:1-9) when Mary Magdalene visits the tomb to find that Jesus has risen to new life.

<u>A prayer for Lent:</u> Dear Lord, in this season of Lent, help us to draw near to you in praise, stripping away all that distracts us from worship. As Jesus resisted temptation by the devil in the wilderness, help us reflect on his faithfulness to God; his rejection of worldly values and hold these thoughts in our hearts throughout Lent and into our future lives.

Pray, Fast, Give this Lent: Our chosen charitable theme in school this Lent is to simply pray for the poor and needy around the world; think about the times when we can Fast in line with our Lenten promises; and give food to the poor in our local area. As a school, pupils in Year 5 will deliver donations of pasta, rice, tinned food and UHT milk to the local Food Bank in Eastwood, before we break up for Easter. Thank you for your kind donations.

<u>The Easter Performance by Assisi and York Classes:</u> Our Easter story (Good News) was a great success, being acted out this week to our families, governors, parishioners, the wider community – as well as all pupils in school. It is always pleasing to end the lent term in this way, as it helps keep the Easter Story fresh in the children's minds and helps us all to recap the events of Holy Week.

Easter-Egg Hunt, Raffle & Easter Bonnet: A big thank you to our PTA members, who kind volunteer each year to run these important, fun events. This year we will be undertaking these activities outside, on the afternoon of Friday 4th April, as we are blessed with such beautiful weather.

School Wrap Around Provision: From the first day back after the easter holiday, the school's wrap around care provision will increase in price as follows: Breakfast Club (this opens at 7.30am) from £5 to **£6** After school (first session – until 4.45pm – whether in an organised club or doing activities with Mrs Wright in Wrap Around Care) from £5 to **£6** After school (second session – until 6pm – including a snack and doing activities in Wrap Around Care with Mrs Wright) from £5 to **£6**

Free School Meals: Children who officially qualify for free school meals are eligible for the Pupil Premium. This is not the same as universal free school meals for pupils in reception and year groups 1 and 2. Children who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium (including Armed Forces pupils) are charged 50% of the total costs of trips, after-school and breakfast clubs. Diarrhoea and vomiting: This week we have had an outbreak in school with children being affected in each class. The school follows the NHS advice which says: 'Stay off school or work until you've not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days' (48 Hours). Please support us and your child in adhering to this policy, as it helps keep other pupils, their families, and staff safe from the infection.

<u>Ofsted:</u> Thank you to all of you who responded to the questionnaire when the school was inspected in the first three days of the week beginning Monday 17th March. The inspector wished to thank all stakeholders for making her feel so welcome – and especially the children, whom she particularly enjoyed working with. The actual report will not be published until around the middle of May.
